DAY 1 - ARRIVAL

Meal(s) Included: Dinner

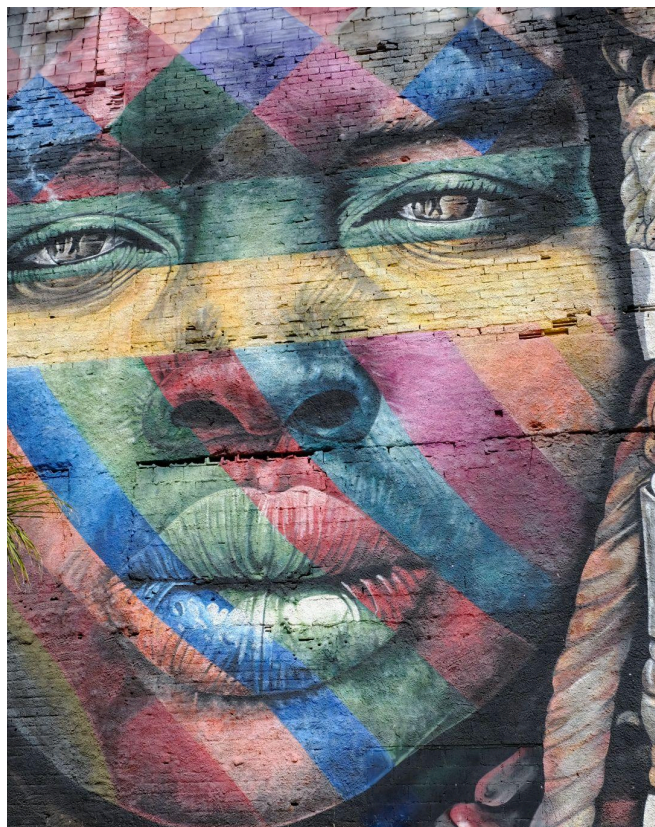
Hotel Check-In: 3 PM local time.

DAY 2 - LITTLE AFRICA

The best way to get to know a destination is by gaining a bit of its history.

Located in Rio's downtown, Little Africa was once the first dwelling of the Africans that arrived in Rio de Janeiro and their descendants. Nowadays, the area is occupied by communities that originated from former enslaved Black people settlements. In the area, cultural activities are all part of an effort to recover and enrich the history and the culture of Rio de Janeiro.

DAY 3 - CHRIST THE REDEEMER & SUGAR LOAF

After breakfast, we will take a 30 minute ride to the train station of the Corcovado Mountain; Towering 700 meters above the city with the 30 meter statue of Christ the Redeemer on top, the Corcovado offers a 360 degree view of the 'Cidade Maravilhosa', that is simply breathtaking.

Once our visit to the Corcovado is finished, we will take a short drive to the Sugar loaf. Upon arrival at Praia Vermelha, at the foot of Urca Hill, stop for lunch at Terra Brasilis restaurant (buffet with dessert included). Then, we board the cable car up to the first level (Urca Hill); we give you some time for pictures and proceed to the second cable car to ascend, the over 300 m high, SugarLoaf Mountain.

After returning to ground level, we continue our journey to Santa Teresa, a neighborhood where laid- backness and tradition meet. But it also brings you street art, such as the amazing Selaron Steps. The beautiful steps done in ceramic by artist Jorge Selarón are one of a kind.

DAY 5 - ISLAND ESCAPE!

After breakfast, we will take a 1-hour drive from Rio de Janeiro to our private schooner in the center of Itacuruça.

You will spend 6-hours on a private tour stopping at beaches and islands in the region; with a stop for snorkeling in Praia Grande and lunch in Jaguanum Island.

On our last night in Rio De Janeiro, we will meet for a farewell dinner to share our trip highlights

Christ the Redeemer - Christ the Redeemer is an Art Deco statue of Jesus Christ in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, created by French sculptor Paul Landowski and built by Brazilian engineer Heitor da Silva Costa, in collaboration with French engineer Albert Caquot. Romanian sculptor Gheorghe Leonida fashioned the face.

Sugarloaf Mountain - Sugarloaf Mountain is a remarkable natural attraction located in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Rising about 1,299 feet, this mountain has been selected as a registered landmark because of its beauty and popularity. It offers spectacular views from the top of the mountain where you can reach through a cable car.

Selaron Steps - One of the most important touristic sites of Rio de Janeiro is this colorful piece of art called Selaron Staircase. In English it translates as the Selaron stairs.

Little Africa - Little Africa, Pequena África in Portuguese, is an area in the Port Region of Rio de Janeiro that has historically been home to a strong Afro-Brazilian community. The area became known as Little Africa following the outlaw of the slave trade in Brazil in 1831 (though the abolition of slavery outright would not come for another 50 years).

Private Schooner - Private full day private schooner to the Tropical Islands. Spend 6-hours on a private tour stopping at beaches and islands in the region; with a stop for snorkeling in Praia Grande and lunch in Jaguanum Island.
